# A LEGACY OF Leadership & Service

For more than a decade, Donna Urian has been a cornerstone of leadership for the YMCA of Greater Brandywine.



What began with service on the Finance Committee of the YMCA of Brandywine Valley in 2012, grew into a seat on the Board of Directors in 2013 and, ultimately, a legacy of steady guidance through seasons of transformation, growth, and transition.

During the historic merger of the YMCA of Brandywine Valley and the YMCA of the Upper Main Line, which formed the YMCA of Greater Brandywine, Donna continued her service with consistency and quiet strength. She remained a steady presence, helping to ensure continuity, sound governance, and mission focus as the newly unified association took shape.

As the organization evolved, so did Donna's leadership responsibilities. She became Secretary of the Association Board in 2018 and Vice Chair in 2020, roles in which she further demonstrated her deep understanding of governance, her commitment to strong process, and her unshakable reliability. In 2022, Donna stepped into the role of Board Chair, leading the organization through one of the most pivotal moments in its history.

During her tenure as Chair from 2022 to 2023, Donna led the search for the YMCA of Greater Brandywine's next President and Chief Executive Officer, culminating in the successful appointment of Bertram L. Lawson II. She guided this transition with clarity, transparency, and care for both people and process.

Reflecting on that season, Bertram shared, "Donna led the CEO search with exceptional integrity and steadiness. From our very first conversations, I could feel her deep commitment to this organization, its people, and its mission. The foundation she helped build continues to guide our work every day."

Even after completing her term as Chair, Donna's service did not slow. In 2024 and 2025, she served as Chair of the Nominating and Governance Committee, continuing to shape the future of the organization through leadership development, board excellence, and a steadfast commitment to strong governance.

Throughout every chapter of her service, Donna remained grounded in the mission of the Y and its power to strengthen communities, support youth, and promote health and belonging. Her influence is woven into the fabric of this organization not through titles alone, but through consistency, integrity, and an unwavering belief in the work.

## DEEPENING OUR ROOTS: Y Achievers

For more than 130 years, the YMCA of Greater Brandywine has been a place where young people find guidance, belonging, and opportunity.

Founded in Coatesville in 1894, the first YMCA in the county was established to serve young men drawn to the region by the industrial boom. Over the years, the Y has become a safe haven – a place where young people are seen, supported, and equipped to reach their full potential.

Today, that legacy takes on new life through Y Achievers — a free program empowering teens and tweens in grades 5 through 12 to set and achieve their educational and career goals. Through mentorship, skill-building, and workforce development, Y Achievers helps Chester County youth build a strong sense of self and the skills needed to thrive in a rapidly changing world. Most importantly, they gain a community that supports them.

In 2025, Teen Programs at YGBW have served over 2,200 teens – and growing.

“Y Achievers is rooted in the belief that every young person deserves a chance to thrive,” shares Jazmyn Hudson, Senior Association Director of Teen Development. “Teens are the leaders, innovators, and changemakers of tomorrow.”

Offered at YGBW’s Coatesville and Jennersville branches, Y Achievers reflects an enduring commitment to youth development as a cornerstone of strong communities. By investing in today’s youth, YGBW honors its own legacy while building the future of Chester County – for the benefit of all.

## MOBILIZING HEALTH FOR ALL: YGBW Fit Truk

Chester County’s beautiful landscape is one of the region’s greatest assets – but its growing population and rural geography can create barriers to health and wellness.

This, combined with limited public transportation and the recent closure of regional healthcare facilities, can make it challenging for residents to access preventative care and wellness services, particularly for those most at risk. The YMCA of Greater Brandywine (YGBW) is working to remove those barriers.

Introduced in January 2025, the YGBW Fit Truk made national headlines as an innovative, mobile and fully equipped wellness hub on wheels, with the ability to bring fitness programming, health screenings and wellness education directly into neighborhoods across Chester County.

“The Fit Truk expands the Y beyond its physical locations, delivering programs directly to schools, parks, businesses, and underserved communities across Chester County,” explains Veronica Lopez, RN, Vice President of Health Strategies. “And our partnerships with healthcare providers allow us to offer vital health screenings via the Fit Truk. Working together, we have a real opportunity to fill gaps across the healthcare continuum.”

### The need is real.

In Pennsylvania’s highest-income county, more than 30,000 residents live in poverty, while nearly 60,000 additional households are working but cannot afford basic living expenses. These factors directly impact access to health care, wellness opportunities, and long-term well-being.

While the Fit Truk is one of YGBW’s most visible tools for change, it is just one part of a broader commitment – to meet every neighbor where they are and ensure no one is left behind.

## CREATING A CULTURE OF BELONGING: Adaptive Programs

At the YMCA of Greater Brandywine (YGBW), belonging is more than a value – it’s a practice lived out every day.

For more than 40 years, YGBW’s Open Doors program has provided adults with disabilities a space to connect, build friendships and be celebrated. What began as a single program has grown into a comprehensive suite of Adaptive Programs serving children, adults, and their families.

Today, that legacy continues to evolve into a culture of belonging. In 2025, 1,905 individuals were served through YGBW Adaptive Programs.

Central to this growth is the power of partnership.

In partnership with EmpowerU Specialty Fitness, Special Olympics of Pennsylvania (SOPA), and Bournelyf Special Camp and with financial support from Bentley Systems, YGBW expanded access to specialized personal training for adults with disabilities. This support helps participants build strength, confidence, and independence.

Through partnerships with the Chester County Intermediate Unit, Main Line Health, and the Vanguard School, YGBW branches serve as workforce readiness placement sites for teens and adults with disabilities. Participants receive job coaching, mentoring, and real-world work experience, building the skills and the confidence to seek meaningful employment.

Together, these partnerships reflect a simple but powerful belief: everyone deserves a place to belong, grow, and thrive — and the Y is committed to being that place for all.

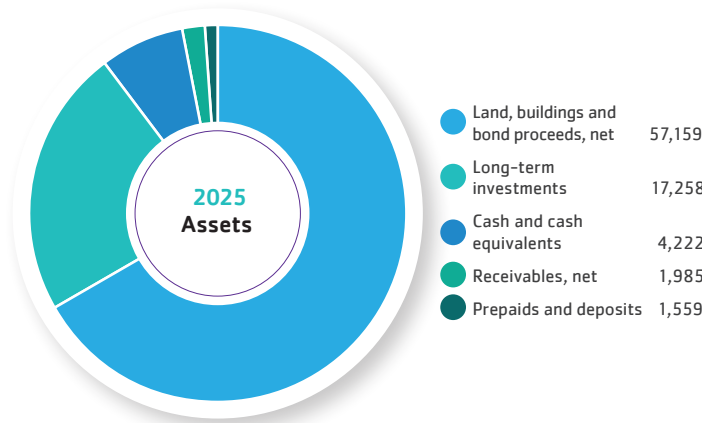
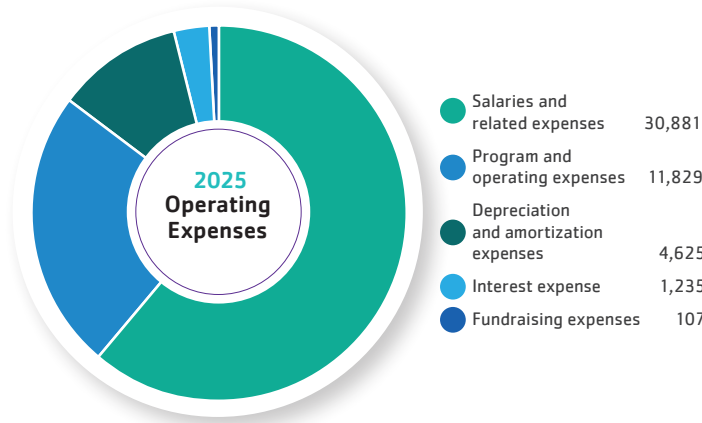
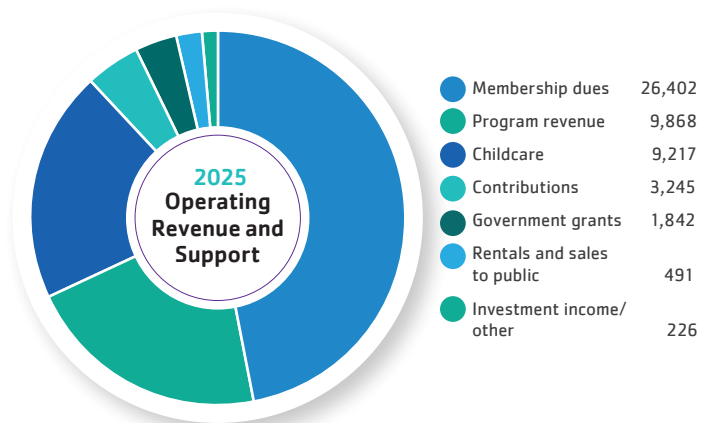
